Course Description	This course explores effective roadside interviewing techniques and methods for establishing and re-establishing rapport during DUI investigations. Emphasizing the critical role of officer demeanor and communication, the course guides participants through best practices for gathering verbal evidence, maintaining professionalism, and improving case outcomes—even in the absence of field sobriety tests or toxicology reports. It includes practical strategies for increasing voluntary compliance, using empathy and structured questioning, and navigating post-arrest interactions to support successful prosecutions. Real-world examples and video demonstrations illustrate both effective and ineffective approaches.	
Learning Objectives	 Identify and apply techniques for conducting effective roadside interviews to elicit evidence during impaired driving stops. Demonstrate methods to build and re-establish rapport with suspects to facilitate cooperation and reduce resistance. Formulate structured and strategic questions that reveal inconsistencies and strengthen impaired driving cases. Apply communication strategies that reduce complaints and increase the likelihood of voluntary toxicology compliance.

Dave has volunteered on his off hours as an impaired driving education expert speaker and has participated in a number of community impact panels.
